Save the NHS Bursary: **Lobby Parliament**

Trade unions like UNISON do far more than just look after you if you get into trouble. UNISON, along with the NUS and other organisations, will be lobbying the government on the 25th May to oppose the removal of the NHS Bursary for healthcare students.



Removal of the bursary in August 2017 will leave students in over 50k of debt, which many will never be able to afford to pay back. When 50% of the course is spent on placement (in effect working for free), and with a starting salary typically £7,000 less than other graduates, it is not surprising that many students said that without the bursary they would not have opted for a healthcare course.

Replacing the bursary system with loans will put off many potential students, not encourage more people into our caring professions. Show the government what we all know: that for many a career in nursing or healthcare would not be possible without the bursary.

That's why UNISON is supporting the junior doctors, and our union offered encouragement to junior doctors across the country. The head of UNISON, general secretary Dave Prentis (pictured) visited doctors at his local hospital in Barnet. He made the link between attacks on workers rights, the broader mismanagement of the NHS and the removal of the NHS bursary clear:

UNISON stands behind the junior doctors as they stand up for their rights at work and for patient safety, but unfortunately these attacks will come as no surprise to student nurses. They are already on the receiving end of one of George Osborne's most foolish cuts – the removal of the student nursing bursary... They will stand side by side with them against a government that is cutting them both adrift.
